
MY BELIEF IN THE AFORESAID IS BASED ON THE FOLLOWING:

This Affiant, a Detective with the Abilene Police Department reports that on July 10, 2009 police were called to 1000 S. Clack, #303 in reference to an injured subject. When they arrived, they found two deceased people. They were identified as Nathaniel Moss, Jr. and Tina Renee Moreno. Both victims had injuries that indicated homicide. The victims were taken to the Tarrant County Medical Examiner where autopsies revealed the causes of death. Tina Moreno died as a result of an incised wound of the interior neck. Nathaniel Moss, Jr. died as a result of multiple stab wounds to the chest. Both deaths were ruled as homicides. Criminalist Officer Clayton Daniels located a bloody fingerprint on a faceplate of a light switch in the apartment. He received a name of a possible suspect from AFIS. The name was Santiago Garza Jr. Officer Daniels obtained a copy of Garza's fingerprints from the FBI and confirmed the match to the fingerprint at the scene. Further investigation revealed that a Playstation III video game system was taken from the residence by the suspect or suspects. Also, Nathaniel Moss, Jr.'s pockets were turned out indicating someone had gone through them. This occurred in Taylor County, Texas.
